The PeaceHealth Southwest ambulatory care pharmacy team is comprised of ambulatory care clinical pharmacists, most of whom have completed ambulatory care PGY2 residencies themselves, who are dedicated and enthusiastic about precepting, expanding ambulatory care services, and developing the next generation of ambulatory care pharmacists. The primary site of practice, PeaceHealth Family Medicine of Southwest Washington, is a community-based University of Washington School of Medicine-affiliated medical residency program. Washington state scope of practice allows pharmacists to become credentialed to bill for services and to practice under collaborative drug therapy agreements, which allow pharmacists to practice at the top of their license while exercising prescriptive authority for a wide range of disease states with independent clinical decision making.

Residency Information

- **Appointment:** Twelve-month residency
- **Stipend:** Approximately \$72,100
- **Staffing:** 20 days providing clinic coverage (Mon-Fri, 8-hour shifts)
- **Other Benefits:** medical, dental, vision, life, and disability insurance available; seven paid holidays; ten days paid time off, plus up to three days for education leave/interviews and three additional sick days if necessary.

Practice Area Rotations

Our program features a robust ambulatory pharmacy practice setting that encompasses key elements of primary care pharmacy practice. There are two primary care clinics for longitudinal continuity experiences, each served by two full-time pharmacists that independently manage drug therapy under extensive collaborative drug therapy management agreements and bill for services provided.
